

Project Protection of White-tailed Eagles in Lithuania

Tasks:

- > Inventory of WTE breeding sites in Lithuania
- Identifying new breeding sites suitable for erecting of artificial nests.
- Erecting artificial nests.
- Raising public awareness and involve local communities by monitoring together WTE, raising nests and taking care of them in future.
- Establishing of network of people who would pursue monitoring after the end of project.
- Preparing of recommendations regarding conservation and increase of population of the species for the Ministry of Environment of the Republic of Lithuania.

- Education on nature protection.










